Flower classes

- 1 Vase of 1 stem of a flowering shrub
- 2 3 dahlia flowers in a vase
- 3 A pot plant 20cm max. top diam. (excl. succulents and cacti)
- 4 A single stem of Gladiolus
- 5 Mixed seed heads and/ or dried flowers in a vase
- 6 A posy of edible flowers and garden herbs
- 7 My garden in a vase
- 8 A cactus or succulent growing in a pot (max. top diam. 20cm (8"))
- 9 Five different flower stems in a vase
- 10 3 stems of Cosmos (can be multiples on a stem)

Vegetable Classes - all items must be exhibited on a plate

- 11 1 sweet pepper or 3 chillies
- 12 A plate of 5 runner beans
- 13 A plate of 5 French beans
- 14 3 trimmed beetroots
- 15 A wonky vegetable
- 16 3 trimmed carrots
- 17 3 potatoes (all same named variety)
- 18 The longest runner bean
- 19 Any other vegetable
- 20 My vegetable plot in a container
- 21 A lettuce (with roots) any variety
- 22 3 onions
- 23 3 courgettes (max length 20cm.)
- 24 A cucumber
- 25 10 cherry tomatoes, calyx on
- 26 5 tomatoes (not cherry type), calyx on
- 27 The heaviest single potato

Fruits classes - all items must be exhibited on a plate

- 28 12 soft fruits of any single variety, e.g. tayberry, strawberry, raspberry, blackberry
- 29 3 apples of the same variety
- 30 3 sticks of rhubarb - trimmed
- 31 5 stems of hedgerow fruits (not necessarily edible)
- 32 3 pears of the same variety
- 33 Any other fruit

Allotment classes

- 34 Best kept allotment
- 35 Most improved plot
- 36 Best demonstration of sustainability
- 37 Best utilization of space

Floral Art classes

- 38 A posy in an egg cup
- 39 A summer sunset
- 40 Reflections

Cookery and Preserves

- 41 A homemade named non-alcoholic drink
- 42 Approx. 8 ounces of a confection, e.g. fudge, peppermint creams, truffles etc. on a plate
- 43 Jam or Jelly in a glass jar
- 44 Pickle or chutney in a glass jar
- 45 Marmalade in a glass jar
- 46 My favourite named cake on a plate
- 47 6 slices of your favourite traybake
- 48 5 cheese scones made to a defined recipe (see programme page ?)
- 49 5 home made biscuits on a plate
- 50 A savoury dish
- 51 A named homemade alcoholic drink

Infant Classes - under 5 years old (including School Year Reception)

- 52 A sunflower head - displayed in a recycled container of water
- 53 A decorated pebble
- 54 A vegetable / fruit animal on a plate
- 55 Cress, mustard or grass, sown in a decorated eggshell, in an egg cup

KeyStage 1 (School Years 1 & 2)

- 56 A miniature garden in a tray (max. size 25 x 40 cms)
- 57 A handmade decorated greetings card (maximum size A4)
- 58 A vegetable / fruit animal on a plate
- 59 A Lego model, original, not from a kit - maximum base size 30cm x 30cm
- 60 A piece of hand writing (max. size A5)
- 61 A homemade wildlife home from natural materials (max. size 20cm x 20cm x 20cm)

Key Stage 2 (School Years 3, 4, 5 & 6)

- 62 A miniature garden in a tray (max. size 25 x 40 cms)
- 63 A vegetable / fruit animal on a plate
- 64 Compose and decorate a poem (max size A4)
- 65 A Lego model, original, not from a kit - maximum base size 30cm x 30cm
- 66 A homemade wildlife home from natural materials (max. size 20cm x 20cm x 20cm)
- 67 A handmade craft

Key Stage 3 (School years 7, 8 & 9)

- 68 A piece of writing (poem or short story) (max. size A4)
